



UTILITY WORK ON SPRING AND SENECA STREETS STARTS SEPTEMBER 4

Starting September 4, utility work will occupy the block between Spring and Seneca streets, west of Alaskan Way (see map below) to install a large electric vault. Expect no vehicle access to this block during the weekdays with one lane open on weekends for approximately two weeks. Following the first two weeks of high impact activities, work will continue in this area with less restrictions for several more weeks to complete electrical connections to the vault. Private utility construction will follow as part of a larger effort to relocate critical infrastructure prior to viaduct removal.

WORK ZONE

- Spring and Seneca streets west of Alaskan Way (see map)

SCHEDULE AND HOURS

- September 4 – 7: 7 AM to 5 PM
- September 10 – 14: working day and night, continuously
- After September 14: weekdays, 7 AM to 5 PM with periodic night work

PARKING AND LOAD ZONES

- On-street parking and load zones temporarily restricted

PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICLE ACCESS

- Traffic in the parking area will be restricted for two weeks between Spring and Seneca streets
- One through lane will be restored by September 14
- No impacts to pedestrian or business access

EQUIPMENT AND NOISE

- Expect construction equipment and vehicles moving in and out of the work zone
- Construction trucks and equipment may be noisy; the most significant noise coming from breaking and removing roadway pavement and from vacuum trucks locating utilities

OTHER AREA PROJECTS

- There are other projects that are or will soon have work around Seneca and Spring streets, including private utility work
