




SPRING ON THE WATERFRONT

WASHINGTON STREET BOAT LANDING PERGOLA


Following the completion of Seawall construction in December of last year, we moved the Washington Street Boat Landing Pergola back to its waterfront home in Pioneer Square. The time-lapse video below shows the Pergola's nighttime journey from the Port of Seattle's Terminal 25 where it was being restored to its permanent home at S Washington Street and Alaskan Way. UTILITY WORK ON THE WATERFRONT STARTS SOON!

Starting in late March, underground utility work will begin on the waterfront. This includes the installation of electrical duct banks and vaults in various locations between Pike and S Dearborn streets. This activity must be completed by late summer 2018 in preparation for Alaskan Way Viaduct demolition.



WHAT TO EXPECT:

- Construction will be completed in sections (see map for details).
- Typical work hours are 7 AM to 5 PM, Monday through Friday. Some overnight and weekend work will be necessary.
- Pedestrian, bicycle and vehicular traffic may be directed around work areas
- Access to businesses will be maintained.



WHERE DID PIER 62 GO?

Construction to rebuild Pier 62 began in early December. The first major activity – removing the old timber deck and wooden piles – is now complete! Upland utility work will continue this summer. When the new Pier 62 is complete, it will enhance
