## THE SOURCE: ECOLOGY

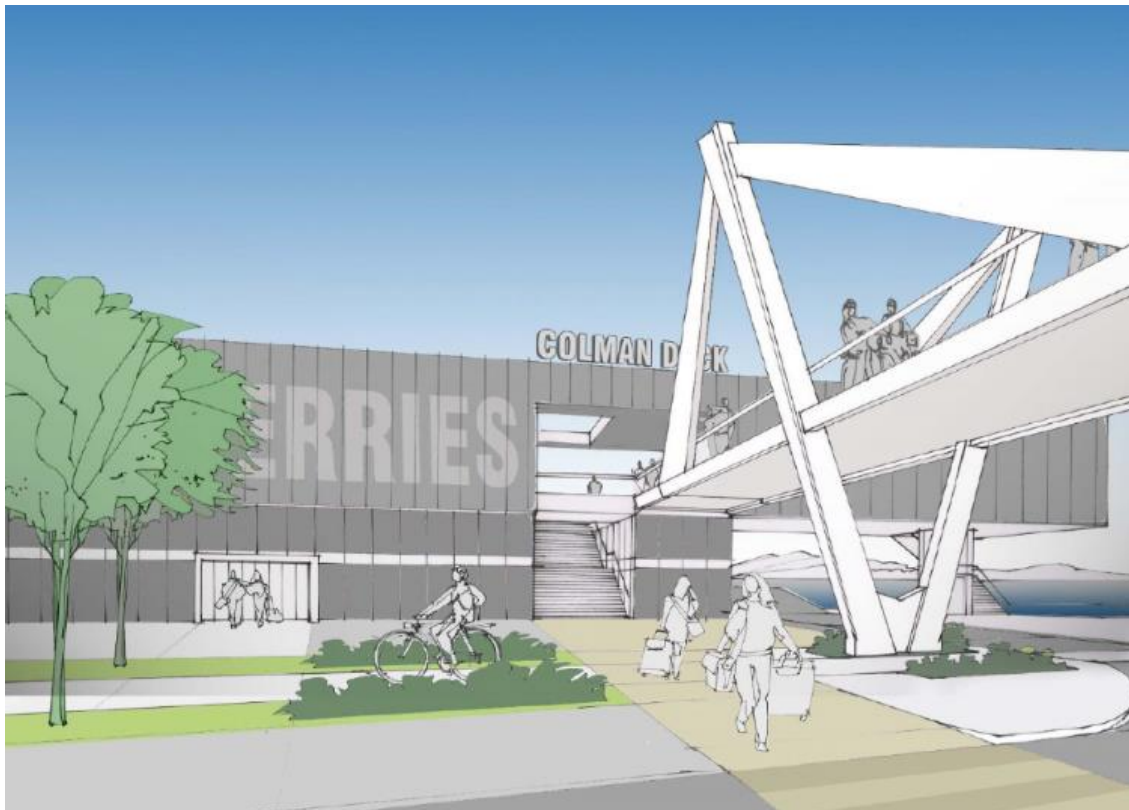
